## NEWS FROM THE TRUSTEES

### WOULD YOU LIKE TO BECOME A SAFER SPACES CHAMPION

1 in 3 women in Guernsey will experience domestic abuse in their lifetime so a large number of women who attend our meetings will unfortunately have been affected by domestic abuse, often suffering in silence.

Safer, Guernsey's  
Domestic abuse



charity, is offering free training to a limited number of members who would like to train to become a **Safer space Champions** within the WI.

- The Safer space Champion is the person within the WI that someone can disclose

abuse to, stopping them suffering in silence.

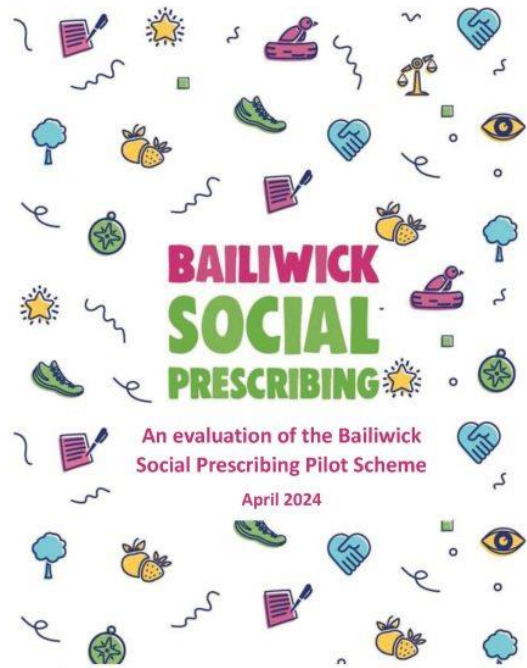
- They are not being asked to become a specialist in handling domestic abuse, nor to take on the role of a healthcare worker or counsellor.

- They will signpost those affected by domestic abuse to specialist help.

Safer spaces Champion training dates are Wed 22<sup>nd</sup> Jan & Thurs 20<sup>th</sup> Feb. The training is from 9:30am to 4:30pm at the Yacht Club with lunch provided. Members must be able to attend either one of these training days.

### BAILIWICK SOCIAL PRESCRIBING PILOT SCHEME EVALUATION



The WI is a partner organisation of Bailiwick Social Prescribing with Link Workers referring clients to the WI where they feel the organisation can help. We know a number of people have been referred since joining.

Evaluation of the scheme was presented to interested parties in October and Fran Torode (Trustee) attended.

The key findings of the report are summarised below:

**The BSP model is feasible and reaches people with non-medical needs that are impacting their health**

- 656 people ranging in age from 18 to 90+, but predominantly people of working age, were referred by a health practitioner to BSP with a range of issues that were impacting on their health, such as mental wellbeing, social isolation, health behaviours and employment.
- Link Workers had over 6000 contacts with clients and made 991 referrals to BSP partner organisations which include community groups, third sector organisations and statutory

**BSP has strong endorsement from Primary Care, community partners and patients.**

- All three Primary Care groups partner with 96% of eligible GPs have referred patients to the scheme. Healthy Minds also refers to BSP.

**There is high demand for BSP which exceeds current scheme capacity.**

- Monthly referrals have tripled over the last three In the second half of

2023, there was an average of 34 referrals per month.

- Referral rates exceed current Link Worker capacity and there is a waiting list which GPs identify as a challenge to patient engagement. Greater Link Worker capacity is needed to meet

**BSP shows promise to positively contribute to people's health and wellbeing as well as the non-medical social factors that shape it.**

- On average, the wellbeing scores of BSP clients measured before and after engagement with BSP show that it was likely to be having a positive
- 61% of people who engaged with BSP, from two Primary Care groups where attendance data were available, had fewer GP appointments (4.1 fewer appointments on average) in the 12 months after BSP engagement compared to the 12 months before.

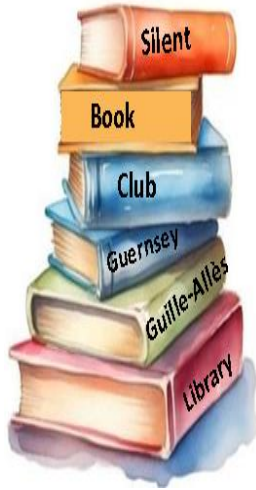

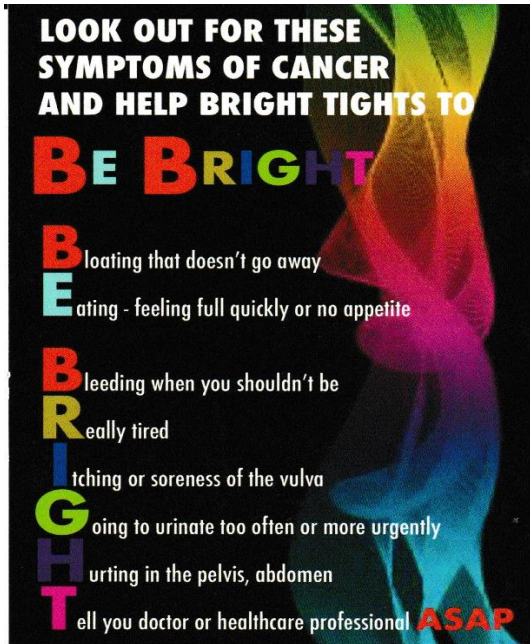
## SAUSMAREZ WI

## NFWI ANNUAL MEETING – A DELEGATE’S PERSPECTIVE BY ANITA WALKER

As someone who had never been to the Albert Hall before, I have to confess that I was more excited about seeing inside it, than in actually attending the National Federation’s AGM. Accounts and minutes and all of that formal ‘WI stuff’ don’t really inspire me and I was all set for a rather long day.



I openly admit I was wrong, and it was a hugely inspiring event and one that I will remember with enthusiasm.

The theme of the year was around the WI’s campaign to end violence against women and girls. In a heart-rending talk from a former chief



prosecutor, Nazir Afzal OBE spoke about how he had become an advocate for vulnerable women and children over his career as a prosecution lawyer.

One event that stuck with him was when a young Pakistani woman who had had an affair with a white man, had gone to a police station expressing fears that her brother and cousin would kill her because of the relationship with this man. The policeman at the time had told her to go home and they would be in touch in a week or two. Sadly, she was subsequently strangled to death by her cousin, who had raped her first so that she knew ‘she had done wrong’ by dishonouring the family. Nazir subsequently convicted the brother and cousin for her murder.

This ‘honour killing’ drove Nazir to want identify the degree of the problem in the UK this represented and to raise awareness of honour crimes amongst other police stations and the government. He has spent his career fighting against these types

of crimes against women and young girls.

Nazir's impassioned speech ended with a standing ovation from the 4,000 WI members in the Hall.

This was followed by Spice Girl, Mel B MBE, who was interviewed by TV broadcaster, Victoria Derbyshire and talked about her abusive former 10-year marriage.



The theme for the next WI campaign, on dental health, achieved over 95% of the votes from members and so this will be the topic lobbied to the

UK government over the coming months.

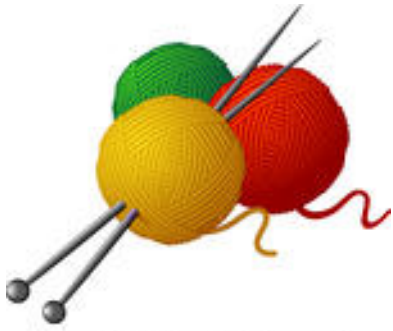

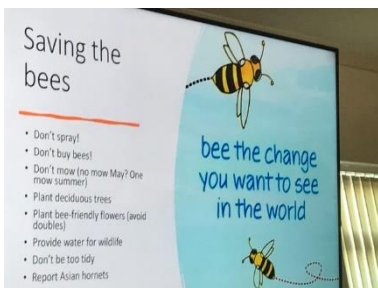


### BBWI BEEKEEPING TALK

## TRUSTEES ATTEND FIRST VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN AND GIRLS SYMPOSIUM IN GUERNSEY

Fran Torode and Dot Williams attended Guernsey's first Violence against Women and Girls Symposium at the Cotils on Weds 12 June.



Organised by Poppy Murray a local campaigner in conjunction with

Guernsey Police, the event was intended to provide an opportunity to hear from guest speakers from the UK and Channel Islands who are leaders in tackling violence against

women and girls across a broad spectrum of areas including policing, research and education, and building safe cities.

The event included a talk from Poppy Murray on her 'Be Lads' campaign – a pragmatic response to the question 'as a man what can I do?'. Poppy's campaign has spread from an idea in her bedroom in Guernsey to being taken up by the Metropolitan police and beyond. An excellent example of how an individual can make a difference.

The HeforShe programme <https://www.heforshe.org/en> is a UN initiative for gender equality. It is an invitation for men and people of all genders to stand in solidarity with women to create a bold visible and united force for gender equality. All UK police forces have signed up to the initiative, including Guernsey Police last year. The programme encourages men to act as Allies, in the workplace and in home life, to raise awareness of gender equality, stand up and call out when things are wrong, not be a bystander, be open minded and support others. Representatives from UK Police forces gave powerful examples of how this approach had made a difference to their organisation to everyone's benefit.

One of the biggest issues about Violence against Women and Girls is a lack of awareness of the problem. Two representatives from Jersey gave a very interesting presentation on research undertaken in Jersey, [www.gov.je/vawg](http://www.gov.je/vawg) which must have many parallels with Guernsey. The research identified a lack of understanding and awareness of violence against women and girls, widespread experience of sexual harassment/assault, and a fragmented, male biased and 'untouchable' systems in Jersey, which fails to protect women and girls and enables perpetrators to do what they do. The recommendations being taken forward include better data capture, awareness and education as well as new legislation and training for the judiciary, family court professionals, healthcare services, police and education professionals.

It was heartening to see so many Deputies in the room, as well as others already working in this area and hopefully this will be a positive step forward for Guernsey.

## JANE DILCOCK'S BEE-LICIOUS HONEY CAKE



### Ingredients

250g [clear honey](#), plus about 2 tbsp extra to glaze

225g [unsalted butter](#)

100g [dark muscovado sugar](#)

3 [large eggs](#), beaten

300g [self-raising flour](#)

### Method

#### STEP 1

Preheat the oven to fan 140C/ conventional 160C/gas 3. Butter and line a 20cm round loosebottomed cake tin. Cut the butter into pieces and drop into a medium pan with the honey and sugar. Melt slowly over a low heat. When the mixture looks quite liquid, increase the heat under the pan and boil for about one minute. Leave to cool for 15-20 minutes, to prevent the eggs cooking when they are mixed in.

#### STEP 2

Beat the eggs into the melted honey mixture using a wooden spoon. Sift the flour into a large bowl and pour in the egg and honey mixture, beating until you have a smooth, quite runny batter.

#### STEP 3

Pour the mixture into the tin and bake for 50 minutes-1 hour until the cake is well-risen, golden brown and springs back when pressed. A skewer pushed into the centre of the cake should come out clean.
